NH FISCAL POLICY INSTITUTE REPORT

- Construction activity accounts for about 3.2% (\$3.35 Billion) of total Gross State Product
- 64 Million in Federal, state and local tax revenues
- Employment numbers still have not recovered for residential construction
- 5,726 building permits in 2022, half from Southeastern Hillsborough and Rockingham Counties
- NAHB estimates that for every 100 new single family homes more than 37 million in local income and 394 jobs in the first year would be generated. With 5.3 million in income and 69 local jobs recurring annually.



HOW MUCH HOUSING DOES NH NEED?

Based on estimated population growth:

- Almost 60,000 units between 2020 and 2030
- Nearly 90,000 units between 2020 and 2040
- To meet production needs, building permit activity must increase by 36% statewide through 2030. This is achievable through a combination of local and state action.

2024 LEGISLATIVE ACTIVITY TO SUPPORT HOUSING SOLUTIONS

Two bills that loosen regulatory barriers on renovations or expansion of existing structures:

- HB 1065/ SB 599: No sprinklers required for 3- & 4-unit conversions
- **HB 1291:** Expand rights to create Accessory Dwelling Units

Funding tools for increasing housing production:

- SB 454: double annual appropriation to the Real Estate Transfer Tax for the Affordable Housing Fund
- SB 364: Historic Housing Preservation Tax Credit
